



We are following recommendations from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and the World Health Organization for preventing the spread of COVID-19. We ask candidates to comply with the health and safety guidelines outlined below when choosing to attend an ISA qualification event. *Local regulations may apply in addition to the guidelines included here.*

Please arrive at least 30 minutes before exam start time and note the following restrictions.

You will not be allowed to test and should reschedule you exam if...	Unless...
You have tested positive for COVID-19	You have been symptom-free and fever-free for at least 72 hours without the use of fever reducing medicine AND At least 14 days have passed since your last exposure, or you have received two negative COVID-19 test results in a row, 24 hours apart
You are currently experiencing or have experienced one or more associated symptoms within the last fourteen (14) days <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • shortness of breath • cough • fever • chills • sore throat • loss of smell 	You have been symptom-free and fever-free for at least 72 hours without the use of fever reducing medicine
You live with or have had close contact with someone who has confirmed or suspected COVID-19	At least 14 days have passed since your last exposure
You have been or are under home quarantine or centralized observation by government or healthcare authorities	At least 14 days have passed since your quarantine or centralized observation has been lifted by the government or healthcare authorities

You will be asked to acknowledge that you meet the above health requirements and that you will comply with the health and safety guidelines listed below while participating at an ISA qualification event.

- Stay at least 6 feet (1.8 meters) away from any other candidates/participants and instructors/assistants during the duration of the program.
- Cover your nose and mouth in case of sneezing or coughing.
- You must bring and wear your own face mask while you're at the test center and throughout your exam. Any surgical or cloth face mask, including a homemade face mask, is acceptable as long as your nose and mouth are fully covered. Candidates without a face mask will be denied testing services.
- To prevent crowding, wait until the instructor or registration assistant tells you to approach the check-in desk.
- Comply with all additional instructions from the instructor throughout the program.
- Some testing locations may require candidates to provide a temperature check upon arrival.
